Newly digitized items from Ricker Library's Collection

Ricker Library continues to contribute items from our collections to the University Library's digitization program. Recent additions have been drawn from our rich collection of pattern books and builder's guides. One such item, *Palliser's American Cottage Homes* (1878), was recently highlighted as the "Digitized book of the week" by the Library's Digital Content Creation unit. Other Palliser publications have also been digitized, including *Palliser's Model Homes: showing a variety of designs for modern dwellings* (Palliser, 1878) and *Palliser's court houses, village, town and city halls* (Palliser, 1889).

Other recently digitized titles include, *The Cottage Builder's Manual* (Worcester, MA: Z. Baker, 1856), *Farmer's and Mechanics Practical Architect; and guide in rural economy* (Boston and Cleveland: Jewett, 1858), and *Bicknell's Village Builder*" (New York, 1872).


