The Librarian's Corner



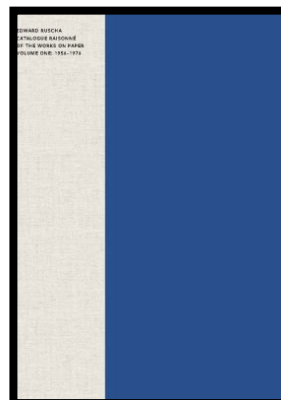

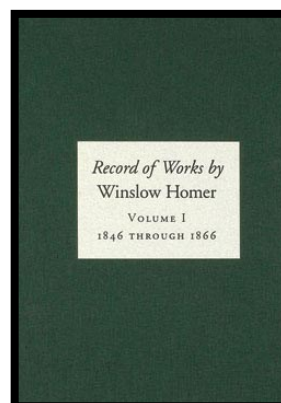

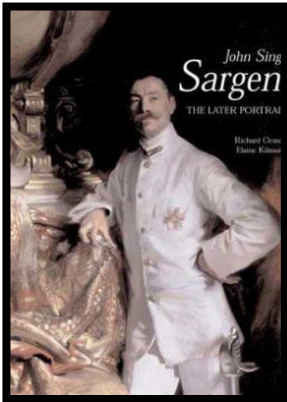

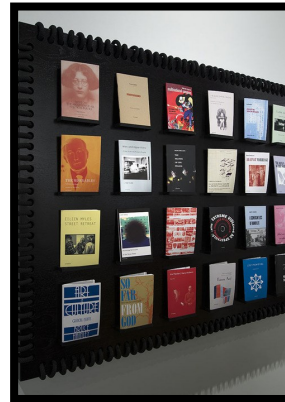
Fifth and final volume of the catalogue raisonné of Homer (1836-1910), covering 1890-1910.

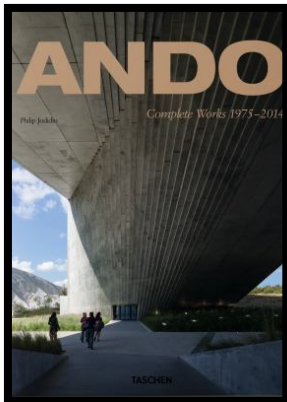
Volume 8 of the catalogue raisonné of Sargent (1856-1925), covering the figures and landscapes from 1908-1913.

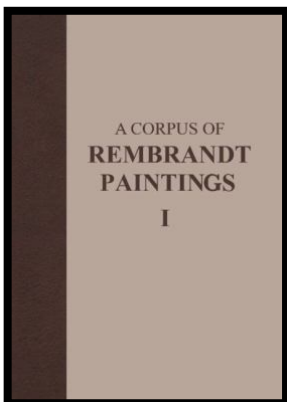

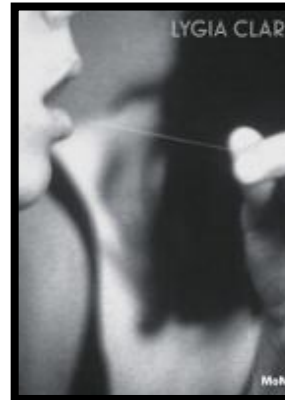

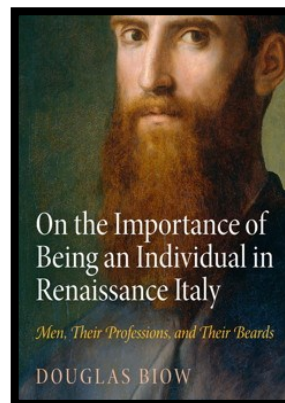

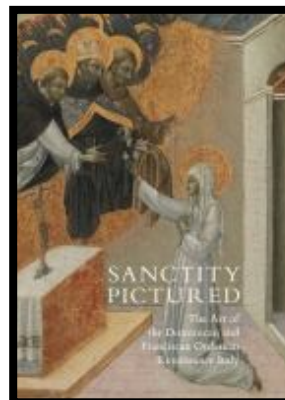

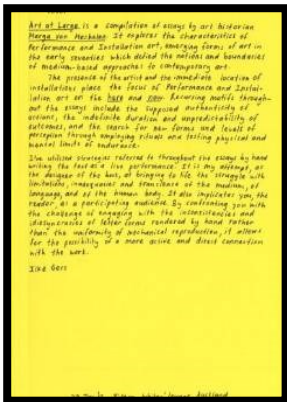

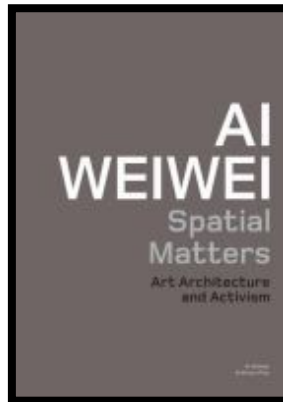

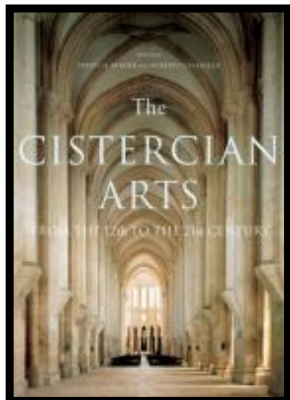

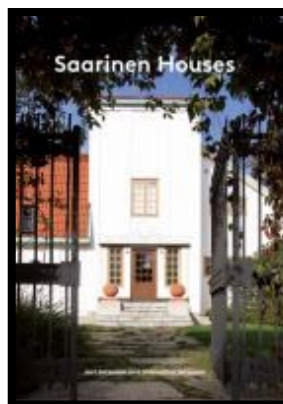

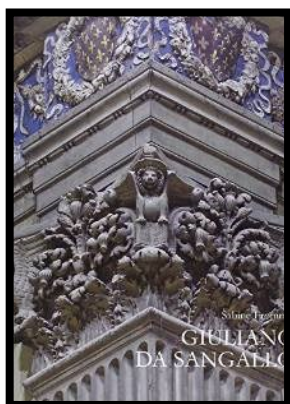

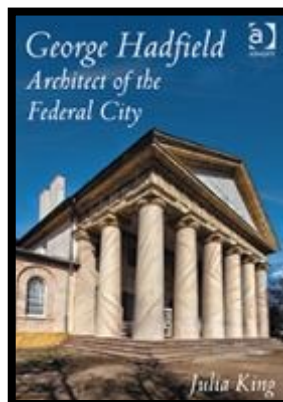

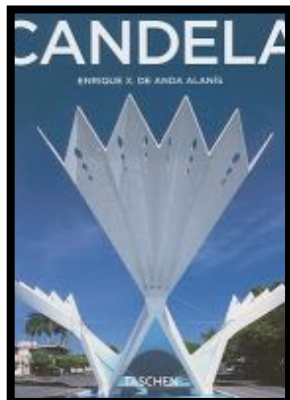

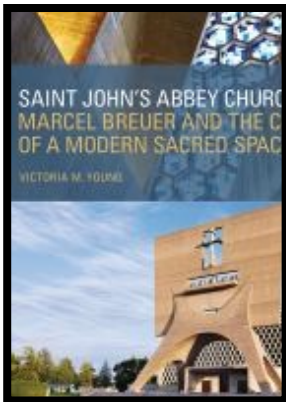

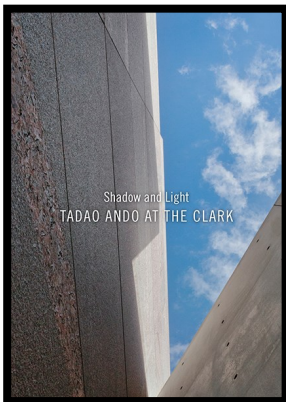
