It did a great job of highlighting all of the University's efforts to humanize this remotely-connected life we're living. I was pleased that the Library figured prominently in the article, both touching on the Library's culture and our efforts to serve the campus.

Our next virtual hangout is on Thursday, May 7 from 11-noon. I hope to see you all there. I feel confident we will have the planning parameters for a return to on-site work by then, and I will do my best to answer any questions.
